

2012 Property Tax Rates in City of Mount Vernon

This notice concerns the 2012 property tax rates for City of Mount Vernon. It presents information about three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual tax rate the used to determine property taxes last year. This year's *effective* tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. *rollback* tax rate is the highest tax rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers start rollback procedures. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amo by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.

If City of Mount Vernon adopts a 2012 tax rate equal to the effective tax rate of \$0.618272 per \$100 of value, taxes would increase compared to 2011 taxes by \$1,5
